

Georgia Poison Center Monthly Call Summary March 2008

In March 2008, the Georgia Poison Center received 9,198 calls. Of which 6,812 calls were related to human exposures, 610 calls were related to animal exposures and 1,776 calls were related to general poison information.

The specialized staff at the Georgia Poison Center was able to effectively triage 99% of calls that were received from the general public at the site of exposure without referral to a health care facility by providing simple first aid instructions over the phone.

About 51% of calls received involved children under the age of 3 years.


The Georgia Poison Center provides vital poisoning information as well as toxicology consultations to healthcare professionals. This month, the GPC, received 1,110 calls from health care professionals, making up about 15% of the calls received involving poison exposures.
